Message from the Head

Welcome to the first KILBURN GRANGE SCHOOL NEWSLETTER of the year.

Firstly, I would like to thank you all for the warm welcome that you have extended to me. I already feel like a well-established member of the community and I know that our other new members of staff feel the same.

We intend to send out two newsletters per half-term, the second one being on the last Friday of every half term, in this case on Friday 26th October.

The children have had a wonderful start to the term and have already taken part in some wonderful enrichment activities. Not only have our wide range of clubs started but Year 1/2 have had a visit from a 'Superhero' workshop and Year 3 from 'Zoolab' who showed them a variety of creatures from the rainforest. We also have an assembly and individual class workshops planned later in October in order to celebrate Black History Month.

On the theme of enrichment activities, our football team played a match on Tuesday 25th September and won 5 – 0! Well done to all who took part.

Last term, you and your children voted on which language you would like to see in school as our Modern Foreign Language (MFL) and the winner was Spanish. You will be pleased to hear that Spanish is now being taught in Year 3 and we hope to introduce songs, numbers, colours and shapes in Spanish to children lower down the school, too.

Attend and Achieve

Thank you to all parents who arrive on time and ready for the bell at 8:40am. After the bell rings, we encourage all parents to leave their children or, at the very least, to move outside the gates so that we may close them promptly (according to the playground clock) at 8:45am.

If you arrive after 8:45am, we ask that you sign the late arrivals book kept in the main lobby area. Should you arrive late more than twice in one week, you will receive a 'late letter', sent out on a Friday, outlining how much learning time your child has lost and we will aim to monitor all persistent lateness. Likewise, if your child has attendance of less than 95%, we will monitor closely and will invite parents in for a meeting if attendance does not improve. Both lateness and attendance were key areas for development highlighted by our Ofsted inspection in July.

Please note that **NO HOLIDAYS WILL BE AUTHORISED DURING TERM TIME** and absence on the first and last day of a term due to illness will require medical evidence.

We thank you wholeheartedly for supporting us in trying to improve persistent absence (classed as less than 95% attendance at school) and attendance figures.

Please see the attendance grid outlining where we stand compared to the national figure of 96.5% for attendance.
