# Kilburn Grange School Uniform Expectations

Items indicated in orange will need to be purchased at the school uniform shop (Uniform4Kids) or the uniform shop website. Parents can choose whether to purchase it all at the uniform shop or go to any shop on the high street for the items not in orange. Children must wear the uniform and bring their book bag or backpack to school every day, including on any trips.

Please label each item of uniform (including the tie and book bag) with your child's name. Please ensure your child knows where you have written their name on their uniform, as children are expected to look after their own belongings.

### Winter Uniform

- White long/short sleeved shirt
- Grey logo jumper and/or cardigan
- White, grey or navy knee/ankle socks for Pinafore (girls)
- Plain coloured socks for trousers
- Grey, navy or black cotton tights (girls)
- Navy trousers
- Navy Pinafore or skirt (airls)
- School tie
- School logo blazer (optional)



### **Outwear and Accessories**

- Navy Kilburn Grange School book bag or backpack (backpack is recommended from Year 3 onwards)
- Any winter gloves, scarf and hat
- Any winter jacket/coat
- White, navy or black hijab
- Black school shoes (The shoes should be sensible for both indoor and outdoor learning and plain black with a good non-slippery sole. Please ensure children wear school shoes with a Velcro fastening until they can tie their own shoelaces.)



#### P.E. Kit

- Orange with logo Polo shirt
- Navy reflective tracksuit bottoms or navy jogging bottoms
- Navy reflective tracksuit top or navy sweatshirt
- Navy or black P.E. shorts
- Plain coloured socks
- Plain white or plain black trainers (Please ensure children wear trainers with a Velcro fastening until they can tie their own shoelaces.)



#### **Summer Uniform**

- Navy Kilburn Grange School baseball cap or plain coloured sun hat/cap
- Plain white Polo shirt
- Navy short trousers
- Summer dress light blue/white check
- White cotton tights, long or ankle white socks for summer dress (girls)
- Plain coloured socks for shorts



## **School Uniform Changeover Periods**

Winter uniform is acceptable from the start of school in September through to the start of the Summer Term. Summer uniform may be worn from the start of Summer Term through to half term in October. The school blazer is optional throughout the school year.

## Jewellery and Make-up

- Children with pierced ears may wear a single stud-earring or a pair of stud earrings to school which we recommend is removed for all sports/P.E. for safety reasons. Children must not wear rings or necklaces or any form of jewellery to school. Plain watches (not toy watches) may be worn; however, they must be removed prior to playing sport and during P.E. lessons. If there is a religious reason for wearing jewellery, please seek permission from the Head teacher.
- Children may wear belts when they know how to fasten them confidently.
- Hair should be kept tidy and secured away from the face. Hair covering eyes must be clipped back to ensure it is away from the eyes. Long hair should be tied back, away from the face on P.E. days. Hair styles that include part-shaven heads or designs cut into the hair are not appropriate for school. Hair bands, clips and other hair accessories should be plain coloured. No oversized, brightly coloured bows or hairbands as they can be a health and safety hazard. Children are only allowed to wear headdress to school for religious reasons.
- Children must not wear make-up, including nail polish. If children come to school with dyed hair or highlights, they may be asked to have them corrected as this is not permitted in term-time. Press-on tattoos should be washed off/removed for school.

# **Belongings**

Each child has a named peg in their classroom where they leave their coat and belongings. Please encourage your child to put their things away on their peg to help prevent things from getting lost. We kindly ask that children don't bring toys into school. Toys from home can get lost or broken, causing distress to the child. We prefer children not to bring mobile phones to school. Should parents (who have given written permission and completed a risk assessment for their child in Year 6 to walk home alone) wish their child to carry a mobile phone, they must let the school know and their child must hand their phone to their class teacher every morning.
